sent a text message: "Come to L.A. I'm looking for a good practice."

Groh, who maintains an apartment in San Diego, joined Haas for a workout. Afterward, the offer was immediate. "He said, 'Good, I like it. Come to Delray Beach," Groh said.

Since then, the two have traveled together almost constantly. Groh, 30, handles both coaching and hitting duties for Haas, 34, as they move from ATP tournaments to exhibitions (Brazil in December) and back to Los Angeles.

"It's a challenging job," Groh told ATR, describing his traveling and coaching duties.

"It's like we were married," Groh chuckled, "we're doing everything together. It's a lot of fun.

"I'm grateful that a guy like this gave me an

opportunity," Groh said.

With Groh at his side, Haas has earned more than \$750,000, defeated Roger Federer in the finals of the Halle grass court warm-up for Wimbledon and gained the finals at Hamburg and Washington. Haas lost to Novak Djokovic, the eventual winner, in the Shanghai quarterfinals.

In 2002, Haas ranked second in the world. In 16 years as a professional, he has earned more than \$11 million in prize money.

Groh is no stranger to the tour, at a different level. In 2001-2003, Groh played in ten Futures tournaments across Europe, North Africa, the Caribbean, and the United States, winning 6 of 16 matches and earning nearly \$1,800.

Aztec Women's Coach Peter Mattera praised Wais and Aguilar for strong efforts in singles and doubles. He said he was very pleased with Nguyen and Antonana for their fall performances.

Mattera called the women's schedule extremely difficult, declining to single out opponents, not wanting any foe "to get

hold of bulletin board material."

The Aztec men are led by Thorsten Bertsch of Mannheim, Germany, Hunter Nicholas of Park City, Utah; and Derek Siddiqui of Long Beach.

Their teammates are Juan Florez of Bogota, Columbia; Freddy Gelbrich of Isernhagen, Germany; Taylor Hawthorne of Toronto, Canada; Andranik Khachatryan of Burbank, Shiva Sangwan of Chandigarh, India; Spencer Simon of Santa Barbara, and Marvin Tawasi of Heidelberg, Germany.

Aztec Men's Coach Gene Carswell said Nicholas "put up good results" at the All American tournament in Tulsa in the fall. He described Bertsch and Siddiqui as team leaders.

Carswell said matches at USC

(Jan 25) and a home doubleheader against Cal Berkeley and Pepperdine (Feb 28) will be extremely difficult.

Carswell is in his 10th year, assisted by Jeff Thomsen and volunteer Larry Willens. The Aztec trainer, Catherine Ortiz, serves both teams.

Mattera, 2012 Mountain West Coach of the Year, is in his 31st season (19th as head coach). He is assisted by Lindsey Gamp and volunteer Holly Bagshaw.

In 2012, the Aztec men (15-8) finished the season ranked 65th by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association after standing as high as 47th.

The Aztec women (12-14) reached 48th in ITA rankings one week but finished out of the top 75.
